FIRST AID MEASURES

FIRST AID

Ingestion: If swallowed do NOT induce vomiting. Give a glass of water or milk to drink. If poisoning occurs, contact a Doctor or Poisons Information Centre. Phone 131 126.

Eye contact: Immediately hold eyes open and flood with clean water. Ensure irrigation under eyelids by occasionally lifting them. Do not try to remove contact lenses unless trained. Seek medical advice.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothing. Wash skin with soap and water. If skin is irritated, seek medical advice.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air and observe until recovered. If effects persist, seek medical advice.

Advice to Doctor: Treat symptomatically.

SECTION 5

FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Combustible liquid with a flash point > 300°C. Preferably use carbon dioxide, dry chemical or foam. If no alternative use soft stream water and contain all runoff. If containers are ruptured contain all runoff.

Hazards from combustion products: If product burns it will emit toxic fumes such as carbon dioxide. Firefighters to wear self-contained breathing apparatus and suitable protective clothing if risk of exposure to vapour or smoke.

Precautions for fire-fighters and special protective equipment: Isolate fire area. Evacuate downwind residents. Wear full protective clothing and self contained breathing apparatus. Do not breathe smoke or vapours generated.

SECTION 6**ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES****Emergency procedures / Material and methods for containment and cleanup procedures:**

Accidental release: In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses. No special requirements for this product, but for good handling practises it is recommended to wear overalls and rubber gloves as a minimum.

In the case of spillage, stop leak if safe to do so, and contain spill. All spills will result in potentially hazardous slippery surfaces and should be dealt with promptly. Absorb spilled material with absorbent material such as sand, clay or cat litter and dispose of waste as indicated below or according to the Australian Standard 2507 - Storage and Handling of Pesticides. Keep out animals and unprotected persons.

After spills, wash area preventing runoff from entering drains. If a significant quantity of material enters drains, advise emergency services. Thoroughly launder protective clothing before storage or re-use.

SECTION 7**HANDLING AND STORAGE**

Precautions for Safe Handling: No smoking, eating or drinking should be allowed where material is used or stored. No special requirements for this product, but for good handling practises it is recommended that when opening the container and preparing the spray, wear overalls and rubber gloves.

Conditions for Safe Storage: Not classified as a Dangerous Good. Store in the closed, original container in a well ventilated area away from children, animals, food, feedstuffs, seed and fertilisers. Do not store for prolonged periods in direct sunlight. Classified as a Combustible Liquid (C2) for the purpose of storage and handling, in accordance with the requirements of AS 1940. Refer to State Regulations for storage and transport requirements. [C2 combustible liquids have a flash point > 150°C].

SECTION 8**EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION****Exposure Guidelines:**

No exposure limits have been assigned by Safe Work Australia to the ingredients in this product.

Biological Limit Values:

No biological limit allocated.

Engineering controls:

Keep containers closed when not in use. No special engineering controls are required, however make sure that the work environment remains clean and that vapours and mists are minimised.

Personal Protective equipment (PPE):

General: Avoid inhalation of spray mist. Wear appropriate protective clothing as per relevant agricultural chemical manufacturer's specifications.

Personal Hygiene: Clean water should be available for washing in case of eye or skin contamination. Wash skin before eating, drinking or smoking. Shower at the end of the workday.

SECTION 10**STABILITY AND REACTIVITY**

Chemical Stability: Product is considered stable in ambient conditions for a period of at least 2 years after manufacture.

Conditions to avoid: Avoid heat sources. Avoid contact with strong oxidizing agents such as chlorine and organic peroxides.

Incompatible materials: As above.

Hazardous decomposition products: If product burns it will emit toxic fumes such as carbon dioxide.

Hazardous reactions: Polymerisation is unlikely.

SECTION 11**TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION**

No specific data is available for this product as no toxicity tests have been conducted on this product. Information presented is our best judgement based on similar products and/or individual components. As with all products for which limited data is available, caution must be exercised through the use of protective equipment and handling procedures to minimise exposure.

Potential Health Effects:

ACUTE EFFECTS

Swallowed: Low toxicity. Ingestion of large quantities may cause nausea, vomiting or diarrhoea.

Eye: The concentrate may cause mild irritation of the eyes. May cause redness and discomfort.

Skin: Unlikely to cause skin irritation, but may be mildly irritating from repeated or prolonged exposure.

Inhaled: Inhalation of mists or sprays may produce respiratory irritation.

Long Term Exposure:

Chronic toxicity: no information available.

SECTION 12**ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION**

Environmental Toxicology: No data available.

Environmental Fate: DO NOT contaminate streams, rivers or waterways with the chemical or used containers.

SECTION 13**DISPOSAL CONSIDERATIONS**

Spills and Disposal: Persons involved in cleanup require adequate skin protection - see section 8. In case of spillage, contain and absorb spilled material with absorbent material such as clay, sand or cat litter and dispose of waste as indicated below or in accordance to the Australian Standard 2507- Storage and Handling of Pesticides. Keep out animals and unprotected persons. Keep material out of streams and sewers. Vacuum, shovel or pump waste into an approved drum. To decontaminate spill area, tools and equipment, wash with detergent and water and add the solution to the drums of wastes already collected and label contents. Dispose of drummed wastes, including decontamination solution in accordance with the requirements of Local or State Waste Management Authorities.

Disposal of empty containers: Triple or preferably pressure rinse containers before disposal. Add rinsings to spray tank. Do not dispose of undiluted chemicals on-site. If recycling, replace cap and return clean containers to recycler or designated collection point. If not recycling, break, crush or puncture and bury empty containers in a local authority landfill. If no landfill is available bury the containers below 500 mm in a disposal pit specifically marked and set up for this purpose clear of waterways, desirable vegetation and tree roots. Empty containers and product should not be burnt.

SECTION 14**TRANSPORT INFORMATION**

Road & Rail Transport: This product is not classified as a Dangerous Goods under the Australian Code for the Transport of Dangerous Goods by Road and Rail. This product is a Schedule 5 Poison (S5) and must be stored, transported and sold in accordance with the relevant Health Department regulations.

Marine and Air Transport: Product is not classified as a Dangerous Good according to International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code and the International Air Transport Association (IATA).

SECTION 15**REGULATORY INFORMATION**
